- 1 Our U15 Tier 2 team coached by Robert Cava entered into 6 tournaments and League Play . On the season they medaled in 3 tournaments and at one point ranked as high 19th in the province . They also hosted their League Play playoffs where they earned a silver medal . For 2024 , his team will be moving up to tier 1
- 2 Our U17 Tier 2 team coached by Jeff Saracini entered into 6 tournaments and League Play . On the season they medaled in 3 tournaments and at one point ranked as high as 7th in the province . They also hosted their League Play playoffs where they earned a bronze medal .
- 3 Our U17 Tier 1 team coached by Penny Gatza entered into 6 tournaments (4 U.S.) and Exhibition Play . On the season they medaled in 2 tournaments and at one point were ranked as high as 2nd in the province . For 2024 , Penny's husband Dave has taken the wheel in their quest for Gold .
- 4 Our U19 Tier 2 team coached by David Haick entered into 6 tournaments and League Play . In what was David's last year at MSBA , his team had fun and appreciated their time here . Thank you to David and his coaching staff for many years of service at MSBA .

From the House League side:

- 1 Our only House League softball team (U23) coached by Jeff Domet was made up of 13 girls that really enjoyed playing together on and off the field . There was improvement in 2023 from their previous year . Jeff has switched gears and has decided to come back for 2024 . He has 7 or 8 girls committed which is quite impressive based on this age group .
- 2 House League Softball is back at MSBA for 2024 so a budget will be necessary to acquire equipment . Something that will be assessed in March based on how registration numbers look at that time .
- 3 With the addition of House League Softball in 2024, the workload will be too much for me to manage on my own with coaching, convening 3 age groups and manning the helm of VP. I am pleased but mostly thankful that my friend and career softball girl, Kelly Darcy will be assisting me to make MSBA the softball destination in Mississauga. Kelly has spent most of her life playing, coaching, managing and convening the game in Mississauga at the House League level. She and her daughter Gabby have come back to MSBA to make the move to Rep. This is a really big get for all of us here at MSBA, thank you Kelly.

Batting Cages:

Highlights - well maintained and managed by all , coaches for the most part were respectful of this luxury that we offer .

Areas of Concern

- 1 Netting needs to be repaired or replaced for 2024
- 2 Green turf batters boxes in rough shape. Material is in the clubhouse to replace in the spring
- 3 VP's MUST send routine reminders to their coaches about respecting the next group and putting equipment away after their session .

Note: Between the season of 2017 to 2024, a total of 37 coaches have left the MSBA Rep teams. Out of the 37 only one (1) has left because the team reached the Midget age. Three (3) other coaches had left because their players moved to Elite, 33 for another reason. For the same period, the MSBA teams got 27 new Head Coaches, reducing the total of our teams by 52% from 23 teams in 2017 to 11 teams in 2024 season.

TRYOUTS

- 2023 Tryouts started after the Labor Day weekend in September. In previous years, tryouts started one week after the Labor Day weekend.
- > Starting 2021 season we adopted a standard on-line tryout registration for all the players. The process saved time, we increased the number of players registered by 67% from 2021 to 2024 season and coaches were able to pre-plan the tryouts while also gathering accurate player information.


> GRASSTOOT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR ROOKIE BALL DIVISION

- Starting 2017 an All-Star House League Rookie Ball exhibition games were organized, as well select HL players were invited to practice with the Rookie Rep teams. During the first two years the participation was average. Due to several factors such as the inconsistent players attendance, lack of participation and commitment from the house league players during the 2019 season the All-Star exhibition game was cancelled. We also noticed that the participation of players from the house league did not represent any substantial increase in the participation of Rep tryout on these years.
- The situation was evaluated at the end of the 2020 season, and we decided to implement our free Grassroots Development program starting on July 2021, it was offered to all the players of the house league between 7 to 10 years old. This program was run independently of the house league regular practices taking place on Saturdays from 9:00 am to 11:00 am from July to end of August, also, for the 2023 season also, we increase the number of call up's players to these division groups, as a result of this new approach the participation of players from 2021 to 2024 tryouts season increased from 51 to 118 players in total (for the 8U, 9U and 10U division group 132%)


RELEASES

> Starting the 2020 season Mississauga North, Mississauga Majors and Mississauga Southwest agreed to an open release tryout.


Note: Below you can see comparative graphs per year in relation to player releases to other organizations and from other organizations to MSBA

❖ MSBA REP and SELECT PLAYER REGISTRATION

- ➤ OBA implemented a new registration system, our Rosters submitted and approved as scheduled (184 players 2022 season and 182 for the season 2023).
- Players are required to complete an online registration with MSBA as mandated by Baseball Ontario. The completion of registration also confirms that the players being registered have reviewed the player code of conduct and the Province of Ontario's Rowan's Law. Failure to comply will result in ineligibility to play and be on the team roster.
- 2024 season Rep Fees were collected in October 2023 First Installment (275.00 per player only one team pending to pay)

❖ UNIFORM FITTING

- Corbett's Source for Sports has been the provider over the past years
- > Some complaints were the same as previous years. Also some items were not delivered on time

❖ PLAYER TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT: Fall, Winter Training

Coaches designed and facilitated their training program based on both the team's and gym's possibilities.

❖ GYM TRAINING

> Private facilities and school gyms were available this year.

❖ COACH'S TRAINING & CLINICS

NCCP CLINIC: Baseball Ontario continuing to closely monito coaches' certification. They have been sending updated information about NCCP status. Almost all our Head Coaches and Assistant coaches full-fill their NCCP requirement for the level that they are coaching

❖ BEST EVER CLINIC

> This year 12 of our coaches attended the Best Ever Clinic (BEC).

❖ COACH'S MONTHLY MEETING

- MSBA Rep coaches typically meet monthly on the last Sunday of every month which started in the beginning of September in preparation for the tryouts and ending in May in preparation for the season. This year all our meetings took place at MSBA Club House, having almost 100% participation.

Highlights:

- Thanks to our board's efforts to maintain operations in 2020 & 2021 during COVID, the MSBA now has Mississauga's strongest HL baseball program. Most other HL programs are only a fraction of their pre-COVID size. The MSBA grew again this year to 17 HL teams, almost back to the 19 teams from 2019.
- The MSBA contributes seven teams to the 18 team MBLL, even though Majors /North/Erindale/Oakville together have nine times the number of households.
- We had well balanced teams at all four age groups, despite constant rain during our April 29th Evaluation Day. Adam Merrett ran abbreviated sessions under very difficult conditions.
- Six of our ten tyke/peewee teams reached the championship game in one of our two tournaments. The tournament featured a tie and several one-run games, including the tyke championship that finished 7-6 with the tying and winning runs both in scoring position when the last out was secured.
- Our four bantam teams finished in spots 1, 3, 4 & 7 in the 8-team MBLL. Congratulations to the Blue Jays for reaching the MBLL championship!
- Our three midget teams finished in spots 1, 2 & 4 in the ten-team MBLL.
 Congratulations to the Cardinals for winning back-to-back MBLL champion-ships (the fourth straight MBLL championship for MSBA midget teams).
- Our seven bantam & midget teams in the MBLL combined for a cumulative .607 winning percentage during the regular season.
- We had another very strong group of HL coaches. Thanks especially to Joe Skotcher who was head coach of two teams - Tyke Blue Jays AND the Peewee Orioles. Congratulations to Austin Haasz, who received a record number of nominations and was selected MSBA HL Coach of the Year.
- Austin Haasz created a post-season skills development camp that attracted 85 players over three weeks and generated many very positive reviews. Austin followed this with 33 one-on-one private lessons to help prepare individual players for their upcoming rep tryouts. Both programs were tremendous successes and should be continued for future seasons.
- The MBLL season was well run and another great success. Thanks to MBLL Commissioner Adam Merrett and midget Convenor Shawn Neil.
- Bryan Bando's on-field coaching clinics were well attended and very beneficial. Our HL focus on "coaching the coaches" is likely the single

	,
	biggest factor behind the MSBA's continued success versus other associations.
	 An exceptionally well-managed registration process enabled coaches to be in place and teams to be organized and ready to go first thing in the spring.
	 Despite a province-wide shortage of umpires, there were almost zero HL games played this season without two qualified umpires in place.
	Derek Snider created a tyke all-star team that competed in the
	Woodstock Select tournament. They missed a spot in the semi-finals by only a fraction of a run on a three-way tiebreaker. Select tournaments at peewee & bantam were sold out by the end of January, so we were not able to enter HL all-star teams at these age groups. We already have 2024 all-star coaches in place and will be ready to go as soon as next summer's tournaments are posted.
	Several players made the jump from HL to rep at tryouts this past September. After the HL season, Derek Snider created an all-new peewee T2 Rep team for 2024. This team is made up entirely of former "HL fives" and former rep/select players from other associations. The decision-making process used by the board to "green-light" this team should be followed when similar situations arise in the future. A new team being considered must have adequate numbers, adequate skill (HL "fives" or above), proven coaching, and must not threaten the viability of the MSBA's internal HL program.
Areas of Concern:	Much of the HL equipment is in poor condition and needs to be replaced.
Opportunities:	 In spite of the weather, our second Equipment Exchange was another great success. It is much appreciated by many lower income and/or new to baseball families. Two carloads of equipment remained at the end of the day. This remaining equipment was donated to underprivileged kids playing baseball in the Dominican Republic. This program could be expanded for 2024. Increased enrolment, especially at younger ages, can be directly
	attributed to excellent marketing and social-media efforts by our Communications Team. Additional resources for this team would likely reap great benefits.
	 Additional board members should be trained in May as "emergency umpires".

Building Committee

The building operations for Mississauga Southwest Baseball Association, went smoothly for the 2023 season. Starting in January we tendered out a proposal to have the washrooms upstairs painted and vanities replaced. At a cost of 8,000.00 dollars it was completed by February 28, 2023.

Our HVAC system was in need of cleaning and repair which was completed at a cost of 5,000 dollars.

We entered into a yearly agreement with Abell Pest control to eliminate and maintain our annual mouse infestations. To date it has worked extremely well.

The clubhouse premises were once again rented out for numerous activities such as birthday parties and association meetings. Our biggest sponsor was Creative Kids, a day care organization, which rented the space for 10 weeks, generating revenue of over 11,000 dollars.

MSBA gave back to the community time and space to the Salvation Army Church and the Mississauga Food Bank. We donated the upstairs room for their annual toy drive and food bank donations during the month of December.

Our snackbar and BBQ had a very good comeback season thanks to the return of tournaments. Our association continues to be recognized with the baseball community as a premier destination for OBA and PWSA tournaments. Our revenues were at a high of over 37,000 dollars which generated a net of over 4,000 dollars. All of our tournaments were sold out with a record revenue for the Bantam Eliminations of over 12,000 dollars.

Thanks to Jeff Saracini and Elaine Bando for their inspiration and efforts in promoting three new BBQ events. WEENIE Wednesday, Philly Steak Sandwiches and Southwest Brisket weekends were a huge hit.

Moving into 2024 we expect some changes to our staff as the age out and get more permanent jobs. With the growth of our proposed Girl's House League and again tournament growth we expect another banner year for the operations.

Normal wear and tear on the building will require additional costs but we should be able to keep it under the 10,000 mark.
